TRADIVAR PROJECT



ELF, the Council of Bars and Law Societies of Europe (CCBE) and a group of Bars from 11 EU Member States have been awarded an EU grant for the implementation of the TRADIVAR project, acronym for “Training of lawyers on digitalisation of justice and on various areas of EU law”. The project, which will start at the beginning of 2027, has the following objectives:

- To train at least 400 lawyers from 26 EU Member States in fundamental rights and rule of law and on new/revised EU legislation, through the organisation of two hybrid events.
- To train and facilitate exchange of best practices and networking for 290 lawyers from 11 Member States on digitalisation and fundamental rights, through the holding of 9 in-person seminars.
- To make available the material produced in the framework of the project on the ELF's website for free consultation and download.
- To undertake communication activities to reach the largest group of participants and to keep EU Bars and lawyers informed about the project

- To contribute to the EU's ambitions in terms of lawyers trained in EU law.

The main result of the project will be increased knowledge in key areas of EU law for at least 690 EU lawyers, who will be able to give better advice to European citizens and businesses.

TRAVAR 2 FLORENCE HYBRID EVENT

On 25 September 2026, ELF will organise in Florence (Italy) a hybrid training event on digitalisation of EU criminal law, which is co-funded by the EU.

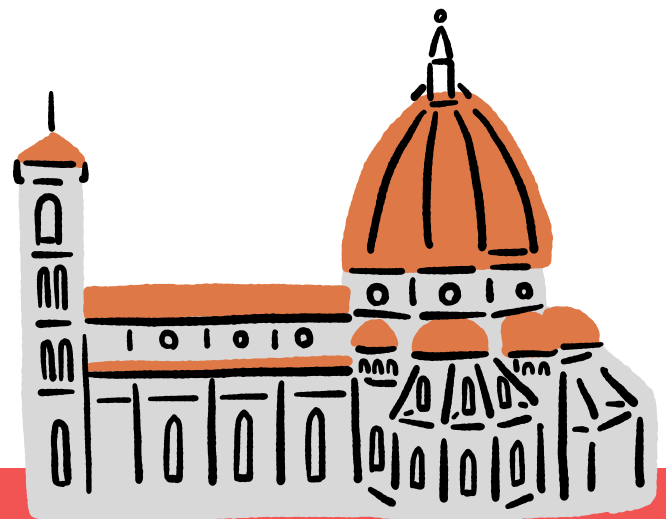
The event will be attended in-person by lawyers from Bulgaria, Cyprus, Greece, France, Romania, Spain, Poland, Ireland and Italy.

Online participation is open to lawyers across the EU and is free of charge. However, registration is required as places are limited. The event will take place in English.

The programme will explore:

- ♦ Digitalisation of EU criminal law instruments
- ♦ Fundamental rights and ethics in digital age
- ♦ Videoconferencing in criminal matters
- ♦ E-evidence procedures
- ♦ Digitalisation of EU criminal law in Bulgaria
- ♦ Videoconferencing in criminal cases in Poland
